This policy statement sets out the school's arrangements for managing the access of providers to the school for the purpose of giving information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the school's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

Student Entitlement

All students in years 7 to 13 are entitled:

- to find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point
- to hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships through options events, assemblies and group discussions and taster events
- to understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses

For students of compulsory school age these encounters are mandatory and there will be a minimum of two encounters for year 8 and 9 students and two encounters for year 10 to 11 students. These provider encounters will be scheduled during the main school hours and the provider will be given a reasonable amount of time to, as a minimum:

- share information about both the provider and the approved technical education qualification and apprenticeships that the provider offers
- explain what career routes those options could lead to
- provide insights into what it might be like to learn or train with that provider (including the opportunity to meet staff and students from the provider)
- answer questions from students

Meaningful Provider Encounters

The Careers Lead and Senior Leader will also ensure that students and parents are signposted to relevant website information on providers and will disseminate printed information as required.

Safeguarding

Providers are expected to comply with the academy's safeguarding policy. DBS checks are not normally required for a single academy visit however we would require a level of supervision to take place which will be considered on an individual event basis.

Opportunities for Access

The school offers the six provider encounters required by law. We will offer providers an opportunity to come into school to speak to students or their families. Please speak to our Careers Lead to identify the most suitable opportunity for you.

Premises and Facilities

The school will make the main hall, classrooms or private meeting rooms available for discussions between the provider and students, as appropriate to the activity. The school will also make available IT and other specialist equipment to support provider presentations. This will all be discussed and agreed in advance of the visit with the Careers Lead.

Meaningful online engagement is also a supplementary option, and we are open to providers that are able to provide live online engagement with our students.

Providers are welcome to leave a copy of their prospectus or other relevant course literature with the Careers Lead who is available to disseminate and signpost information to all students at lunch and break times.
