<p>Modern Foreign Languages is a successful and a popular curriculum area. It is very much valued by staff and students and has a record of strong academic success at GCSE. Languages are hugely important in our modern world, and in our global community, so we believe that the ability to speak a second language is a key skill.</p> <p>We have a high intake of EAL students, we value and promote inclusiveness and diversity. We provide students who have an additional language to gain accreditation in their native language, as part of our Community Language Programme. We strongly believe in languages as a skill for life and are passionate that learning should be fun, developmental, and rewarding for all students. We aim to ignite student’s curiosity and are proud of our students’ languages success. Our aim is for our students to leave our subject with an appreciation of the world.</p> <p>At Wells, we currently offer a GCSE in French. In lessons, we practise, develop, and teach four key skills that are assessed at GCSE: speaking, listening, reading, and writing. The study of French covers a range of themes and topics which are touched on in KS3 and revisited and developed in KS4. These include family, relationships, technology, holidays music, sport, customs, and careers.</p> <p>Learning French allows students of all abilities to become confident and effective communicators in a variety of contexts including on a cultural and a linguistic level. We aim to develop students’ love for languages and language learning, alongside developing confidence in sharing ideas, giving opinions, and expressing themselves in the language they study.</p> <p>The study of French supports students to hold conversations in a second language and appreciate that participation is more important than perfection. We develop students’ skills to recognise patterns in language and use reference materials to support independent study. We focus on teaching key facts about France, French culture, and the world. We believe that it is vital that students develop an understanding of themselves as citizens of the world, value cultural differences and diversity.</p> <p>We want students to be able to use their language and communication skills in future jobs, and proficiency in languages can lead to careers in a wide variety of sectors, such as politics, tourism, journalism, international business, hospitality, or international humanitarian aid. French can open doors to working abroad in whichever industry a student may choose.</p>
